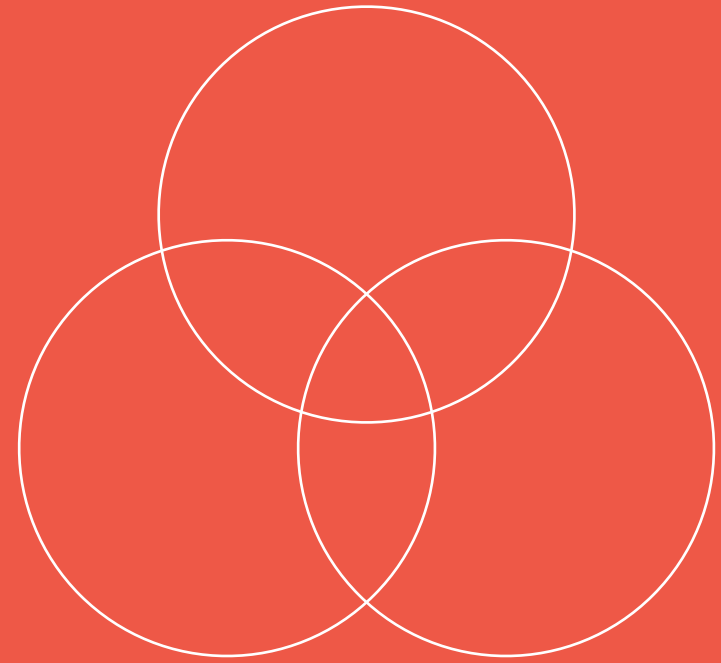

## KUALA LUMPUR TOUR

A magnificent four-day, three-night excursion for families to explore the city of Kuala Lumpur was arranged. For most of these families, it was their first school holiday trip in their lifetime. Some had the opportunity to travel via airplanes from Kedah and Kelantan too. Along with enjoyable activities like games, swimming pool sessions, and MRT ride around the city, educational excursions to Petrosains, IIUM, and Affin Banks were included as well to aspire these children to strive for a brighter future and to dream big.

## EMERGENCY HOUSING HELP

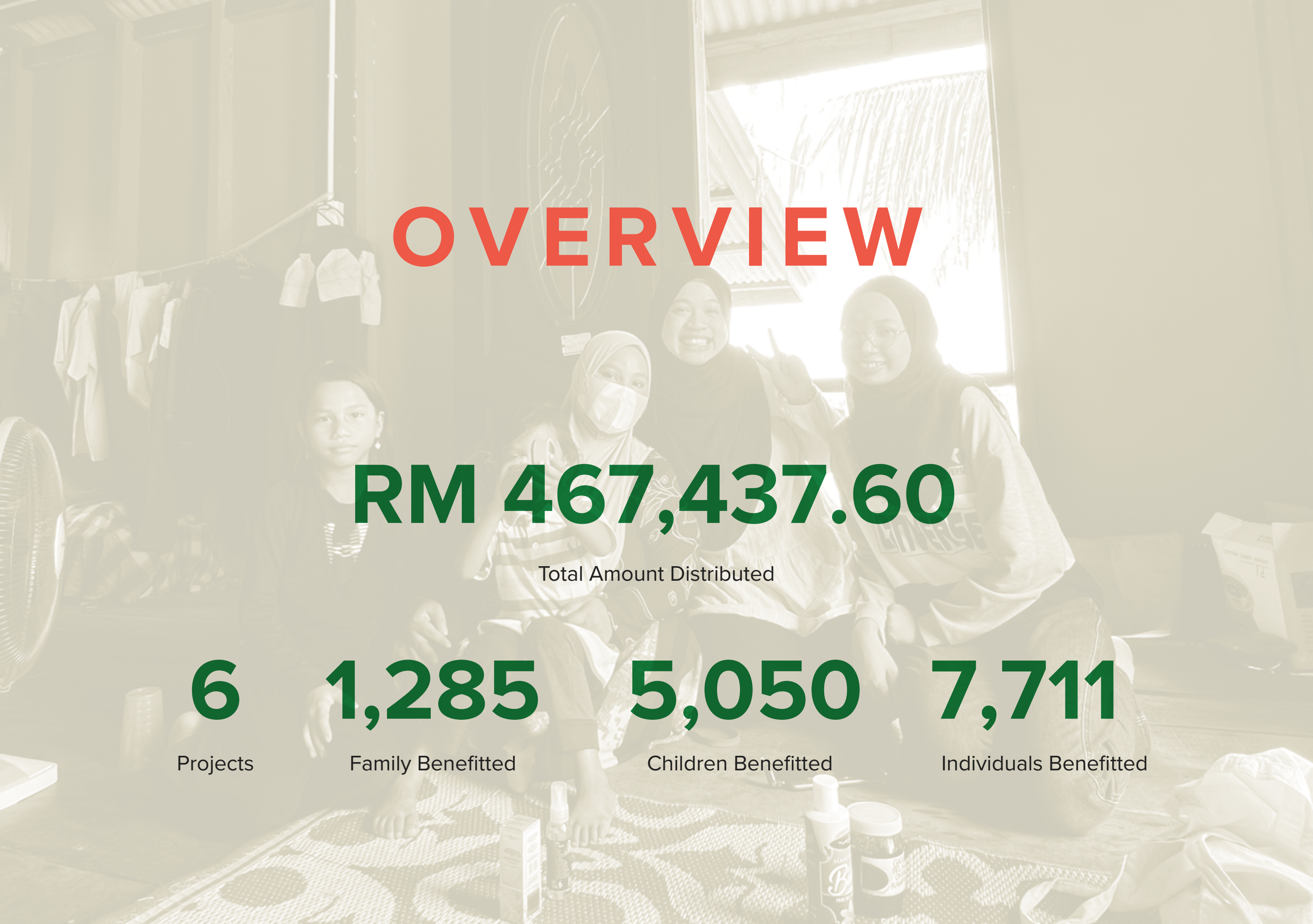
Improper housing has a significant negative impact on the lives of poor children. Some houses were overcrowded and poorly maintained, while some had structural and safety concerns. Children living in these conditions faced anxiety, depression and decreasing well-being. We managed to help several families to move to better housing, and the fees were all covered.

## THE POVERTY ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION AND TALKS

ARBA Foundation were given numerous opportunity to raise public awareness on complex issues of poverty together with experts through several established media platform and organizations such as Astro Awani, Ungku Aziz Centre, The Employees Provident Fund (EPF), Wanita Berdaya Selangor, Universiti Malaya (UM), and International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM). Our best practices and challenges were addressed through these platforms to help communities understand poverty issues and to better develop a more cohesive approach in finding solutions.

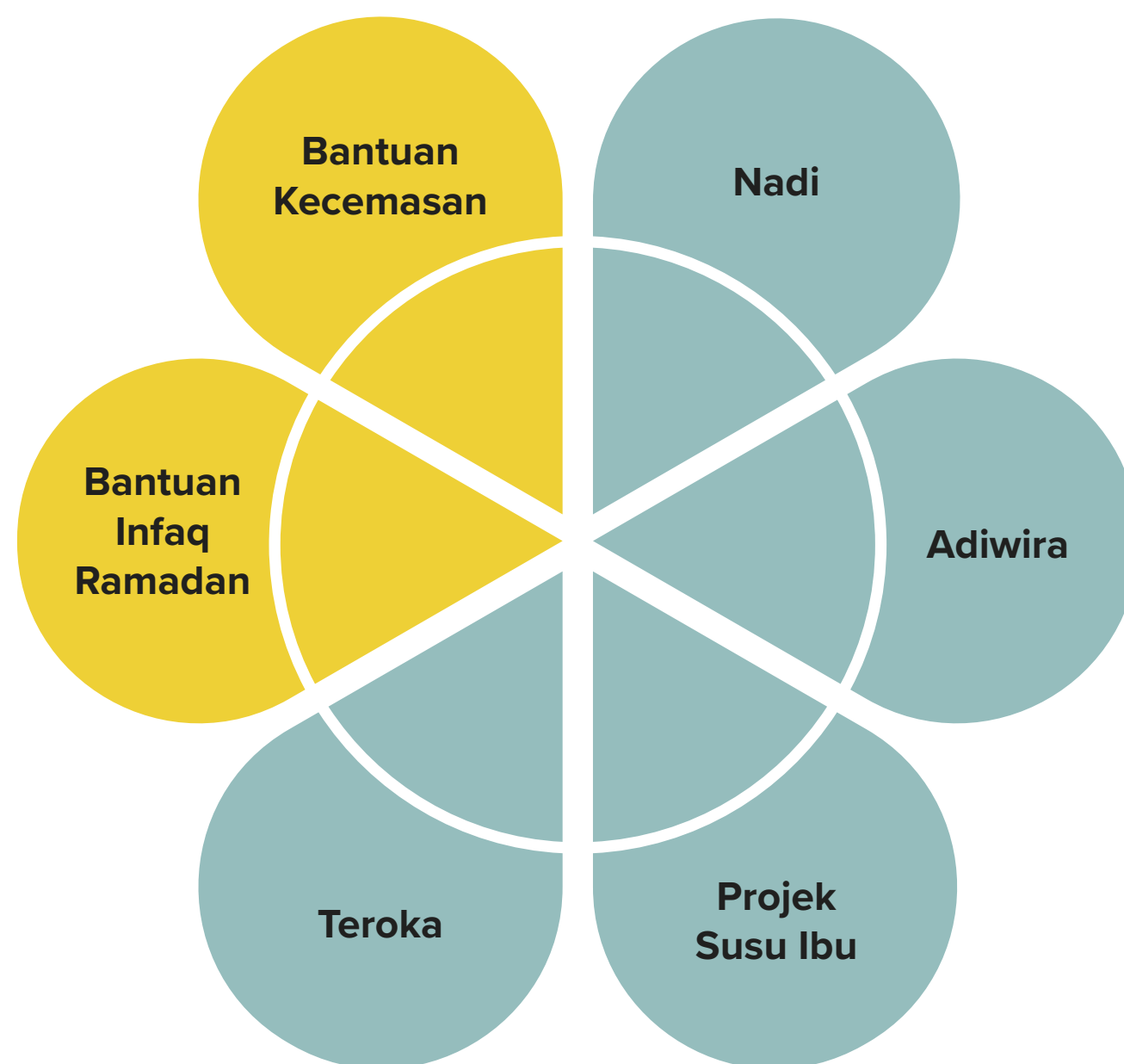

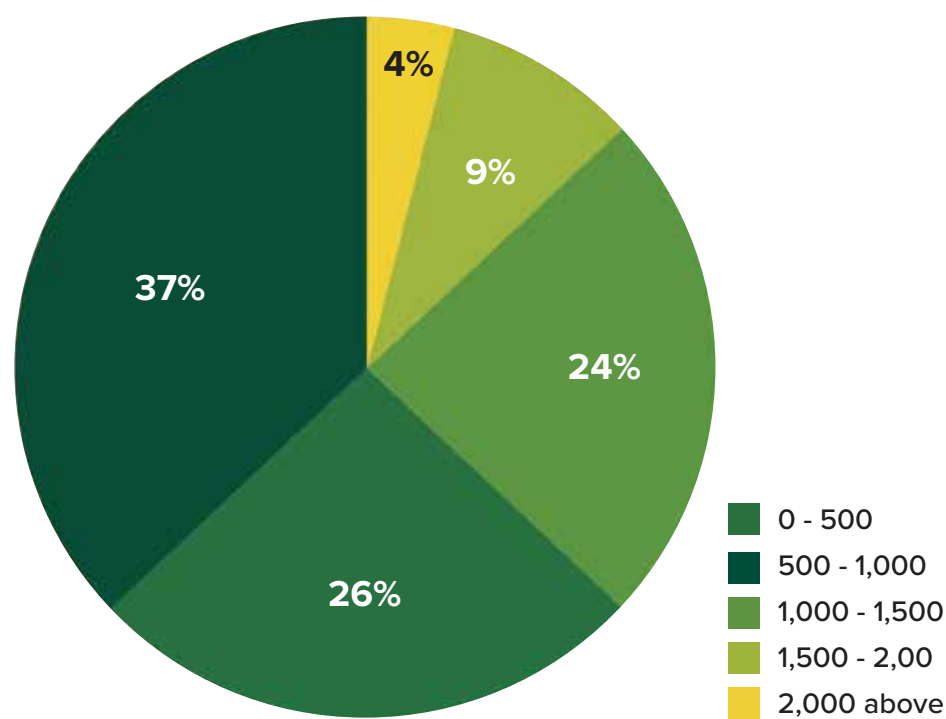

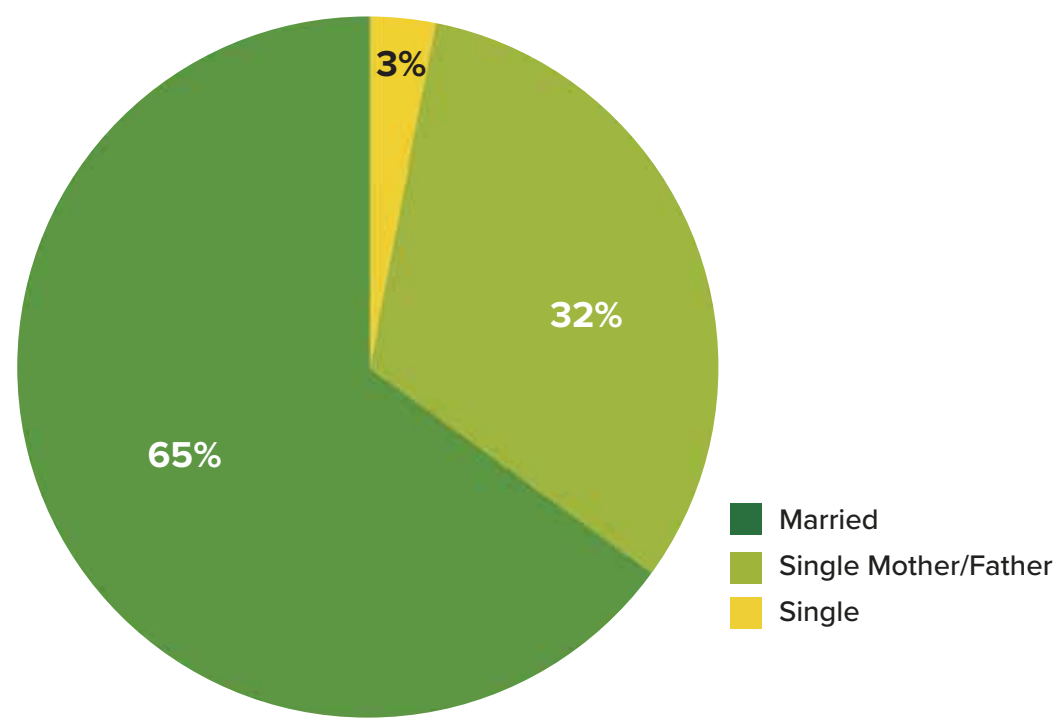

Every family faces unique challenges, whether it's losing a home, being unable to work and pay bills, having a child with a severe illness, or being involved in an accident. Sometimes, these difficulties may intensify seasonally, particularly during school holidays, school openings, hot seasons, or rainy seasons. Emergency applications are submitted using online forms with required documents and evidence attached. A comprehensive screening of every applicant will be completed within 72 hours before approval.

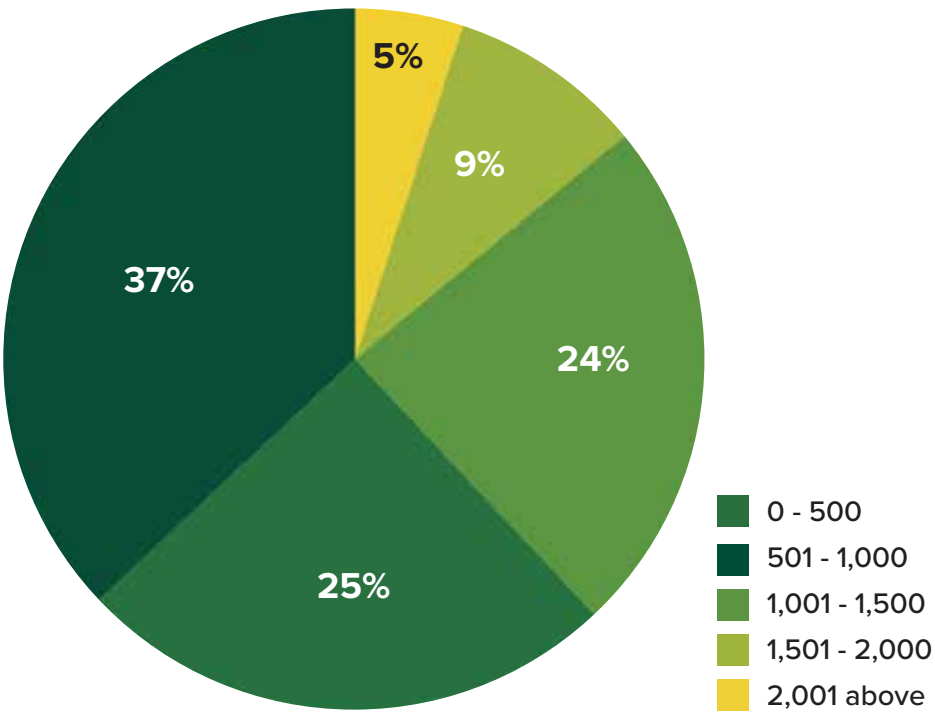

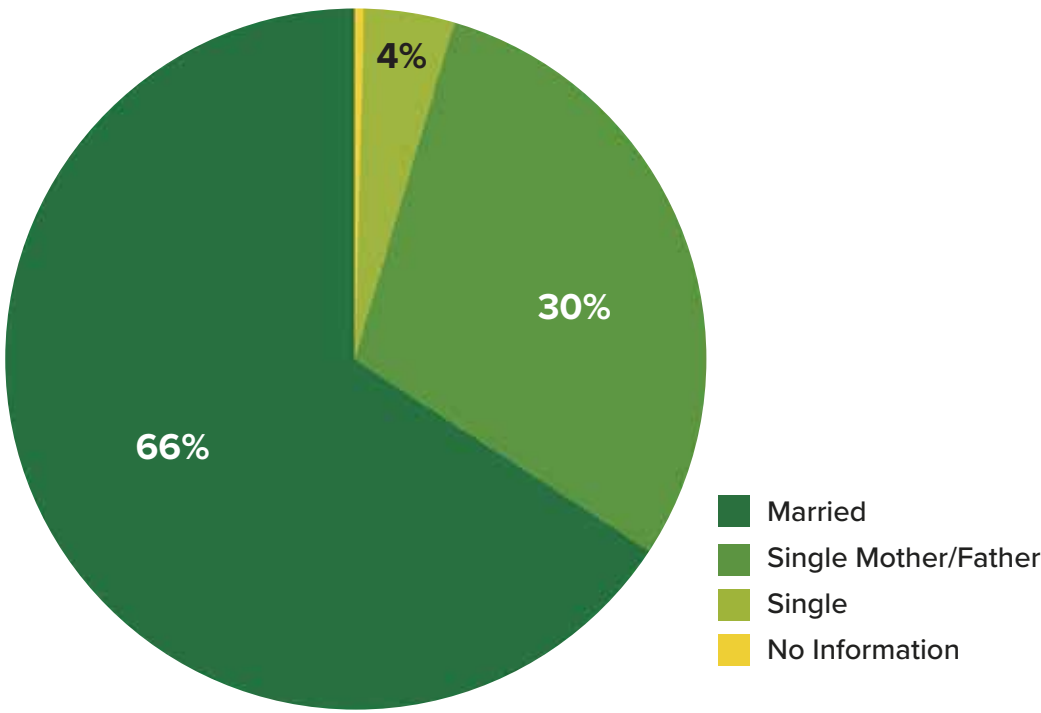

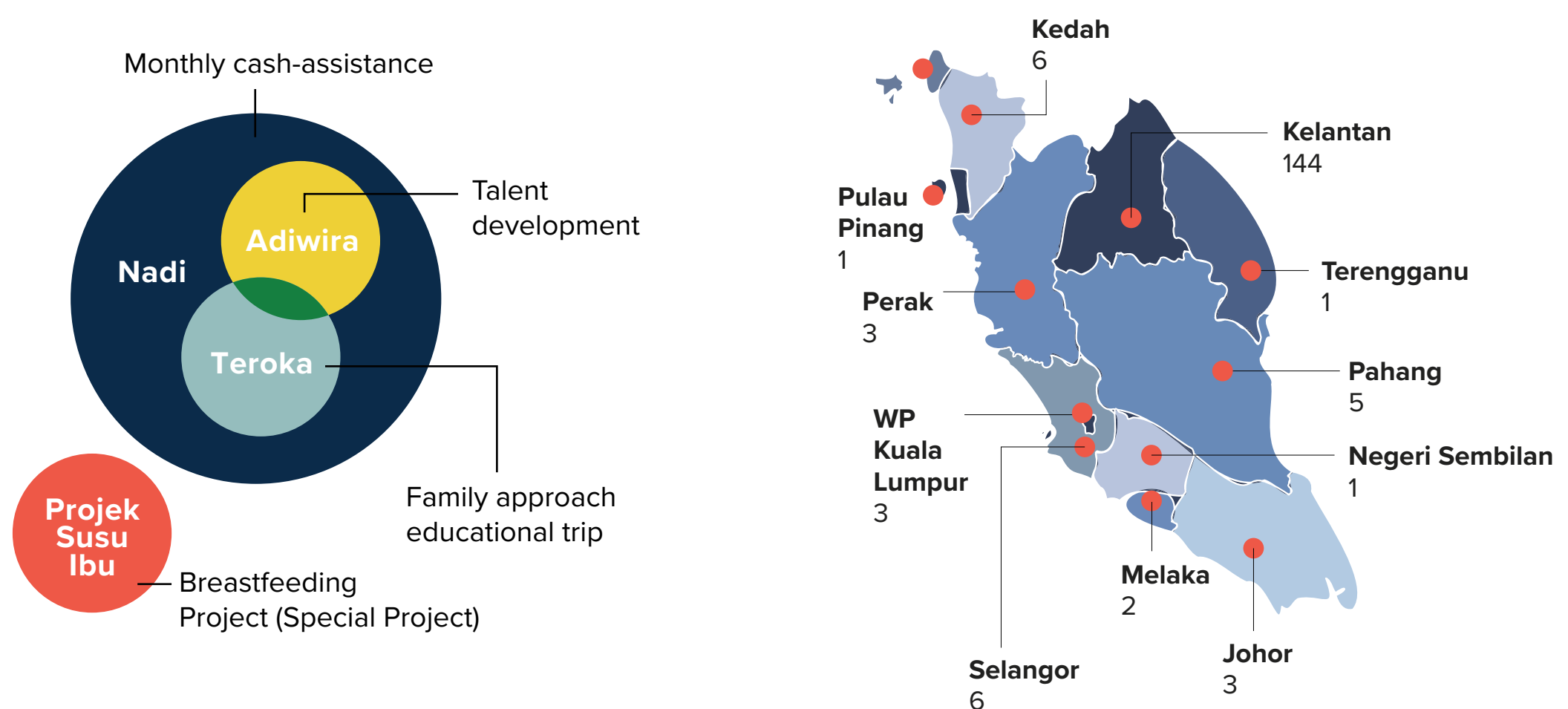

97% of low-income families cannot afford nutritious meals, decent housing, healthcare, or sufficient education for their children. They work several low-wage jobs for long hours yet struggle to make ends meet. The majority are buried under immense debt. We assist these families through Nadi, an unconditional long-term monetary assistance program. Each family has unique difficulties and circumstances. Families living in poverty have the right to make choices to improve their lives and be treated with dignity.

## How Nadi Works?



### 1 Need Analysis

Recipients are mostly sourced from short term program such as Infaq Ramadhan and one-off programs.

### 2 Long-term Cash Assistance

Home visits are conducted to make direct observations on the home environment, family dynamics and lifestyle before agreements are made.

### 3 Progress Tracking

Monthly activities are tracked to monitor their spending priorities and behaviour to encourage progress.



## TRACKING

### Invention of Nadi 2.0 progress book

A customised progress book was introduced as a diary for each family to chart their daily expenditures, dietary intake, and emotions.

By using the progress book, families can gain a deeper understanding of how their daily choices impact their circumstances. The first edition of this book was introduced in 2022, and it has since been enhanced with features like a weekly emotional journal and a monthly working days record, all designed to help you make more informed decisions.



# PROJEK NADI

## Weekly Emotional Journal

A weekly emotional journal acts as a form of emotional release, allowing the families to vent frustrations and anxieties, ultimately reducing stress levels. By writing down their feelings, our team could help identify triggers, patterns, and areas where they might need support.

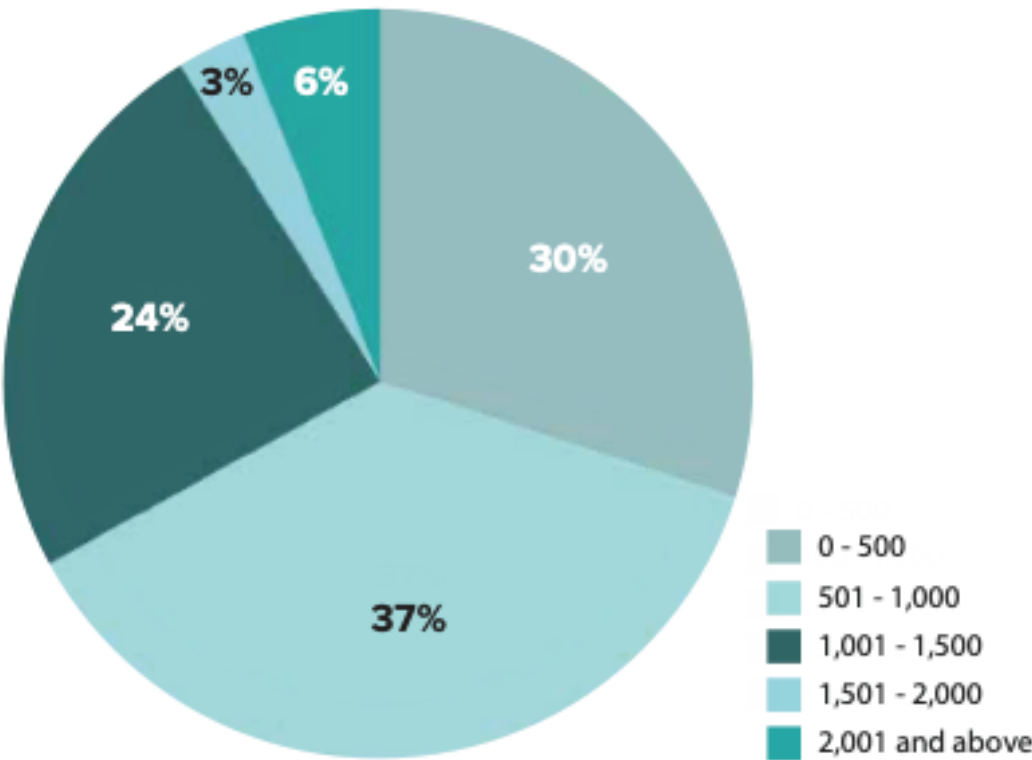

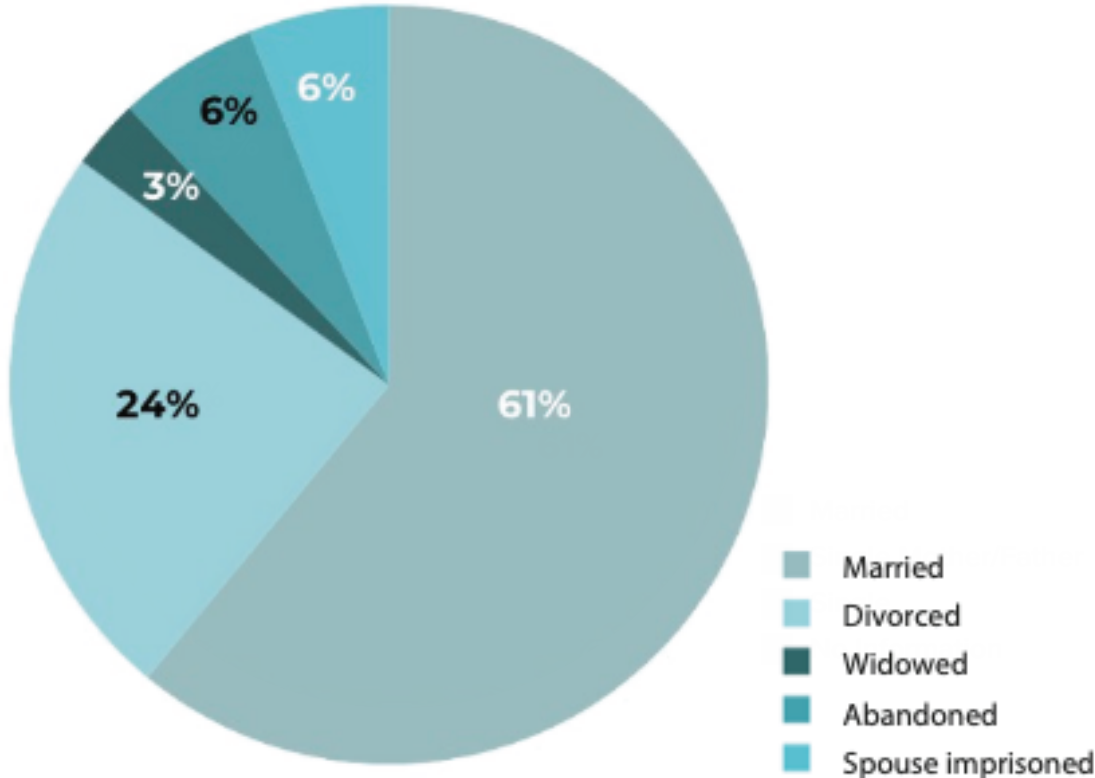

## ENCIK MANAN

Encik Manan is a proud parent who always smiles and tells stories about his children's progress and ambition. Growing up in poverty, Encik Manan did not have the opportunity to complete his secondary schooling, and at the age of 15, he was already taking odd jobs to help his parents in Kampung.



# PROJEK NADI



Living in Kedah, where odd jobs in maintaining paddy fields are prevalent, Encik Manan could only earn RM60 for three days, depending on the weather, planting season, and harvest season.

When no jobs are available in the paddy field, Encik Manan sells drinks and boiled peanuts on the streets near the mosque. People in Kampung referred to Encik Manan as a helpful and trustworthy individual because he is always willing to provide a helping hand. Encik Manan's income is hardly enough to raise his family of four, especially for his children's school expenses. His children are boys aged 15 years old, 11 years old and three years old. His first son dreams of becoming a teacher, and his favourite subject is History.



In November 2023, Encik Manan's family was finally given a better house by the Lembaga Zakat. It meant a lot to his family because they lived in an old timber house for 20 years, inherited from his parents. The roof was leaking heavily, and the hardwood floor had numerous holes, causing his youngest kid to slip and fall multiple times.

Encik Manan, a beacon of hope in the midst of the challenges faced by many underprivileged families, stands out for his exceptional character. Despite the complex issue of absent father figures, he has been a compassionate and deeply involved parent. His unwavering honesty and commitment to ARBA Foundation during every phase of Projek Nadi are truly inspiring and deserving of our utmost appreciation.

# PROJEK ADIWIRA

Learning poverty is growing bigger and faster. Children from low-income families receive fewer opportunities for talent and academic enrichment than children from higher-income backgrounds. As the school year progresses, children in poverty are not able to follow the teachings due to poor comprehension, which leads to lower self-esteem. Projek Adiwira focuses on advancing the education and achievements of children aged 7 to 21 through tailored approaches based on their talents and interests.

We identify the best platform, cover their expenses and track their progress systematically.



## FINDINGS

Out of **114 children** in Adiwira :

**98%** of children that join Adiwira show improvement in their skills and development.

**25** of children unable to join Adiwira because they do not have access to the programs they are interested in within their residential areas.

Most programs are located too far from every family and parents do not have transportation to send their children.

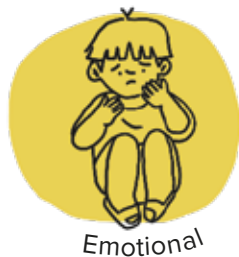

# PROJEK ADIWIRA

## PUAN LAILA

Puan Laila, a single mother of three, was born with a weak right hand. She was married in Thailand, but it wasn't formally documented. Life became challenging as her spouse abandoned her to raise her three children while she was physically unable to work.



# PROJEK ADIWIRA



Aside from her health issues, Puan Laila has a child with Thalassemia. It isn't easy to cope with the necessity of regular hospital appointments for blood transfusions. It is time-consuming and emotionally taxing.

Puan Laila could not afford to rent. Thus, they reside in her parent's house with four other families of Puan Laila's siblings. With four families sharing a home, they have no personal space. They share common spaces such as restrooms and kitchens.

This creates difficulties in ensuring privacy for basic needs and routines. Her children are especially vulnerable to harassment in these settings, and Puan Laila claimed that her daughter has been repeatedly molested by one of her uncles.

For safety reasons, her daughter has requested to be transferred to a boarding school and has been officially accepted. Before that, Puan Laila's daughter received help with additional weekly classes to strengthen her basic spelling, reading, and counting abilities. After a year of support from the ARBA Foundation, her daughter could finally read and write better.



# PROJEK TEROKA

Families with low incomes need help in affording activities outside their homes. These children have been confined to their home environment since birth.

It's a stark reality that many of these children lack the motivation to pursue higher education, primarily because they are unable to see the bigger picture of what life has to offer. With most of their income dedicated to shelter and food, there's no room for family trips during school holidays. However, studies have consistently shown that children who travel tend to have better academic performance and earn incomes that are 12% higher than the average, underscoring the potential long-term benefits of such experiences.

Travelling and educational trips positively impact low-income children's cognitive development, social skills, and mental health. Experiencing new cultures and places broadens their horizons and increases their curiosity about the world.

### 1 Planning & budgeting

Families are offered opportunities with a budget to plan their family trip.

### 2 Make arrangements

Families are empowered to make the decision and necessary arrangement.

Their valuable moments, feelings and excitement were captured to monitor well-being.



## FINDINGS

Vacation does not have to be expensive to be valuable. Even a staycation or a day trip can create lasting memories for these families and provide a break from their struggling routines. They often find creative ways to choose a trip close to home or places with minimal budget, demonstrating their resourcefulness and ability to create meaningful experiences for their children.

Before our every trip, families expressed concern about their children becoming hungry during the journey. They could not afford food outside, particularly in tourist areas, and families were glad to learn that we had provided them with food allowances. Families had immense joy in appreciating all the little things throughout the trips. Their favourite activities were family movie night, group games, swimming in the pool and eating dinners together.

The stunting rates among children in Malaysia are amongst the highest in the region. This is alarming as stunting can lead to reduced immunity, cognitive impairment, chronic diseases, and limited socioeconomic opportunities in adulthood.

Breastfeeding is a crucial practice in combating the effects of poverty on children's growth. It allows infants to thrive during their first few months of life, helping to provide a more equitable beginning for the child. However, stunted growth can become irreversible after age 5, underlining the urgency and importance of early intervention for future success.

## How Projek Susu Ibu Works?



### 1 Identify & qualify

Health clinic officials refer qualified mothers to USM and ARBA Foundation.

### 2 Lactation support

Qualified breastfeeding counsellors are appointed to guide and support the mother to breastfeed the newborn baby exclusively.

### 3 Cash handouts

Mothers receive cash assistance for groceries to ensure they have the means to eat healthy.
